WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?



"...research...found that children's attitudes toward their [medical] condition can influence psychological adjustment...Children who adopt a negative attitude toward their allergies (e.g. focus on limitations and differences from peers) may be more likely to experience distress than children who adopt a more positive perspective (e.g, emphasize strengths and coping strategies).
