

- d. If you ever felt strange or funny, or saw someone with strange or funny signs, why should you not keep it a secret? Who can you tell? (Tell an adult immediately so they can help you)

Teacher's Note: Children can often feel embarrassed to speak up and tell someone about an allergic reaction. It may have been caused by a mistake and they might feel like they will get in trouble. Reiterate that they will never get in trouble when they speak up about an allergic reaction.

Song 6 – C'est La Vie

Listening Activities

- a. Listen and try to name all of the different instruments that are in this song.

Discussion Questions

- a. What language is the phrase "C'est La Vie" from? (French)
b. What does "C'est La Vie" mean in English? (That's life)
c. What is everyone here thankful for?



Teacher's Note: Once you've listened to all of the answers of what students are thankful for, interject by asking if anyone is thankful for being healthy and free. Every now and then we all have a bad day, but it's important to remember all of the things we should be thankful for every day.

Song 7 – One of the Gang

Listening Activities

- a. Sit in a circle and think about the person to either side of you. Think of three reasons why you might be different from them, and three things you have in common.

Discussion Questions

- a. What are some of the things that make you different from everyone else?
b. Does anyone here play a sport?
c. Does anyone here play an instrument?
d. Who likes to play?

Teacher's Note: Connect the fact that we all like different things, but we all have so much in common. After all, we are all part of a group, and group members work together and help each other.
